

WORLD YOUTH DAY 2023 On this Feast of the Transfiguration Pope Francis celebrates the concluding WYD Mass for the estimated 2 million gathered in Lisbon. "Lord," Peter said, "it is wonderful for us to be here!" Forty-four young pilgrims from the Diocese of Meath with Bishop Tom, have participated in this past week's programme of events including the Rise Up Encounters, a series of talks, discussions, prayer and reflections. They have attended a variety of cultural,

religious and festival events to celebrate the joy of this global gathering of young Catholics. Pope Francis has presided over the Welcome Ceremony, The Way of the Cross and over the weekend the Prayer Vigil and now the WYD Mass this Sunday morning. At the end of this WYD Mass Pope Francis will bless the youth for the ongoing Mission which we all share as the witnesses to Christ, under the protection of Our Lady of Fatima. A wee bag to carry on your back may be useful as everyone will need to carry water, some sweets/bars etc and of course weather can be unpredictable so it is advisable to have raingear and also a warm top as it can change considerably when out on the boat and Island. The celebration of Mass will take place along the Pilgrim Path way. Refreshments will be provided on the Island and on the way home if still 'hungry' we will stop in Cavan for a bite to eat. Message of Pope Francis for the Youth of the Church on the occasion of The World Youth Day 2023 Dear young people, now is the time to set out in haste towards concrete encounters, towards genuine acceptance of those different from ourselves. This was the case with the young Mary and the elderly Elizabeth. Only thus will we bridge distances – between generations, social classes, ethnic and other groups – and even put an end to wars. Young people always represent the hope for new unity within our fragmented and divided human family. But only if they can preserve memory, only if they can hear the dramas and dreams of the elderly. "It is no coincidence that war is returning to Europe at a time when the generation that experienced it in the last century is dying out" (Message for the 2022 World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly). We need the covenant between young and old, lest we forget the lessons of history; we need to overcome all the forms of polarization and extremism present in today's world. Saint Paul, writing to the Ephesians, announced that, "now in Christ Jesus, you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. For he is our peace; in his flesh he has made both groups into one and has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us". Jesus is God's response to the challenges facing humanity in every age. Mary carries that response within her when she goes to visit Elizabeth. The greatest gift that Mary brings to her elderly kinswoman is that of Jesus himself. Certainly, the concrete assistance she offered was most valuable. Yet nothing could have filled the house of Zechariah with such great joy and satisfaction as the presence of Jesus in the womb of the Virgin, now a tabernacle of the living God. In that mountain village, Jesus, by his mere presence and without uttering a word, preached his first "Sermon on the Mount". He silently proclaimed the beatitude of the poor and the meek who trust in God's mercy. My message for you, dear young people, the great message entrusted to the Church, is Jesus! Yes, Jesus himself, in his infinite love for each of us, his salvation and the new life he has bestowed upon us. Mary is our model; she shows us how to welcome this immense gift into our lives, to share it with others, and thus to bring Christ, his compassionate love and his generous service to our deeply wounded humanity.
